#### Letter from the Vicar

In the life of the Church, November is a time of beginnings and endings, or perhaps more accurately, endings and beginnings. We begin the month marking and remembering endings, particularly the end of the First World War and, through our collective act of Remembrance, we pray for an ending to war and conflict through the year. Through this ending we also pray for a new beginning. A new beginning of hope and reconciliation through the world.

A week later we keep the Feast of Christ the King, which marks the end of the Church year. All the feasts and festivals of the Church year, beginning with Advent and Christmas, passing through Lent, Holy Week and Easter, and then celebrated through the many weeks of Trinity season, culminate in this Feast. Remembering the victory of God in all things, Christ the King offers us a vision and not only promises that lie beyond our own ends, but also the promise of the new beginnings we are all offered in Christ.

In the last book of the Bible, the Book of Revelation, we are given a great image of these beginnings and endings, as God is described as the 'Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end' (Alpha and Omega being the first and last letters of the Greek Alphabet). What this image always reminds me of is that God is present in all things. Not just when things are going well, or when things get tricky, in all things from the very beginning and the very very end.

In the church, we try to live this call out, perhaps most visibly in our public ministries of Christenings and Funerals. Everyone in this Parish has the right to be baptised and buried in the Parish Church. This is not just a legal point but, for me, a living out of this very real call for the Church to be at the beginning and end of all things as God is. Because, as we will find in this month of endings there is,on Advent Sunday, a new beginning. Beyond our endings we find these new beginnings, and through that know that God is there always.
