#### Class News

#### Tyne Class

All the children have had an amazing start in Tyne Class, settling into the new routines and class-room environment. We have enjoyed reading Elmer and talking about why we are beautiful and unique. In Maths we have started to develop an understanding of numbers to five. We particularly enjoyed showing numbers up to five using our hands and fingers. During phonics we have been thinking about the sound 'm' and matching objects to the correct sound e.g. monkey. You might want to go on a sound walk around your home or the local area finding something beginning with the sound 'm'. You are welcome to upload photos from home to 360, for your teachers to see and share with the class.

#### Thames Class

Thames class have been settling into their new routines very quickly. They have been looking at place value in Maths, counting forwards and backwards and representing numbers in different ways. In English they have been looking at the features of non-chronological reports in preparation to write their own about Neil Armstrong. Perhaps they could research a fact about Neil Armstrong or Space at home. In Science we have started to look at the properties and uses of everyday materials, discussing which materials are transparent or opaque.

#### Rhine Class

In Rhine Class this week, we have been writing diary entries for inanimate objects. The children have been really imaginative - one child wrote about a ruler: I could feel my spine slowly breaking. You will be pleased to know that it didn't break, the teacher intervened in time! In Maths, we have been representing and partitioning numbers to 10,000. In Science, we have been learning about the plant life cycle and went to find seeds in our school grounds, so that we can have a go at starting up a new cycle.

In P.E., we have started our module on Netball and learning the skills of chest passing and moving about to free ourselves up to receive the ball. Our music has been Bob Marley 'Three Little Birds' and we have started our French by learning the French alphabet and counting up to 10. The children all have spelling lists now and our first quiz will be on Monday. Can they please practise these at home this weekend.

#### Nile Class

What a great start to a new year! Everyone has settled back into the routine of school life with ease and the work being produced is of a very high standard. Well done Nile Class! Over the past week we have been creating 3D metal butterflies, working alongside Mrs Coulson (Art Teacher from Hayden Bridge High School). The work produced has been amazing and will be displayed at the Sill as part of an art exhibition involving local schools. Over the next week can the children in Nile class try and name as many British butterflies as possible.
