Our writing styles for this half-term are: traditional tales, instructions and letters. We will have our daily Read Write Inc phonics sessions daily as well as our reading sessions. We will continue to practise our spellings. Our Grammar and punctuation focus will be: conjunctions, nouns and verbs, plural nouns, past and present tenses, noun phrases, capital letters, full stops, apostrophes for possession and suffixes er and est. We will be looking at genres: recount, information text and rhyming words.	Maths In Maths during this half term, we will be looking at money and measurement. Year 1: Measurement: Length and Height: Children understand that height is a type of length and that the language they use changes, depending on what type of length they are describing and comparing. Children will also be exposed to objects that have the same length or height and use the language of "is the same"or "is equal to" to compare. Mass and Volume: We will use the language heavier and lighter before using balance scales to compare objects. We will learn to measure mass by using non-standard units of measurement. We will use different vessels to see which can hold the most volume of water, We will use the language, empty, half empty and full Year 2: Measurement: Length and Height: Children will begin to use units of measurement when measuring heights and lengths. They will use centimetres and begin to use metres to measure objects. They will understand how to line up objects correctly and begin with zero. Mass, capacity and temperature: We will measure in grams and kilograms and use this knowledge to compare the weight of objects. We will use millilitres and litres to measure volume. We will also use the four operations with mass and volume.	Geography: Our Wonderful World We will look at physical and human features, maps, cardinal compass points, and positional and directional language. We will learn about the equator, hemispheres and continents and are introduced to the countries, capital cities and settlements of the United Kingdom. We will carry out simple fieldwork to find out about local physical and human features.
