Class News

In Tyne Class we have been reading different traditional tales 'The Gingerbread man' and 'Hansel and Gretel'. We have enjoyed talking about the different characters and settings in the stories. In Maths we have had lots of fun thinking all about 2D shapes, specifically shapes with four sides. At home you might want to go on a shape hunt. The children have all been fantastic learning the different songs and dances for our Christmas Nativity, all the children loved taking part, hope you enjoyed the show!

Thames class have been very busy practising and performing their Christmas play. I am sure you will agree they were all superstars! We have been working hard to develop our knowledge of 2D and 3D shapes. We are now confident to name shapes and explain how many edges and vertices a shape has. We have been writing letters to Katie Morag to ask her what life is like on the Isle of Struay. In RE we have enjoyed listening to and sequencing the story of the Nativity. We have also shared some amazing DT homework. Thank you for supporting your child with this.

In Rhine Class, the children have completed their non-chronological reports on the Vikings and have started planning their explanation texts. They have also completed their module on multiplication and division for this term and are currently working on area. We have been busy rehearsing our Christmas Performance 'Beauty and the Beast', which is beginning to take shape. In R.E., we have been looking at the similarities and differences between baby and adult baptism and the connections with the baptism of Jesus by John. In art, the children have completed their work on William Morris and we have also been doing our end of term quizzes, angels for the church and props for our play. It was also lovely to go and share our Christmas Carols at the over 60s Christmas lunch. To top it all, we have also had some fabulous homework in.

During Autumn two, the children have been exploring how to create their very own vector drawings by combing shape tools using Microsoft Publisher. The children can resize their shapes, copy and paste a shape and rotate shapes to create images. The children have studied photographs and animals and used the drawing tools shapes in Publisher to replicate these images. What vector drawings can the children find around the house?

The Department for Education guidance for attendance changed in August this year. Head Teachers are now <u>unable</u> to authorise holidays in term time.
