Remembrance Day - A Celebration

Once again, we celebrated Remembrance Day, as a Federation, and marked this with all of our Key Stage 2 children travelling and performing at Holy Cross Church in Haltwhistle.

It was wonderful to see so many of you there to join in with this special event and, as well as being joined by Father Steve, our 'sister Trust Schools' Wark and Newbrough also came. Together, we performed two songs and our Year 6 children took part in readings and poetry recitals. Each of the schools made a Remembrance Day Wreath to lay and we all took part in the 2-minute silence.

We would like to say thank you to Holy Cross Church for hosting us but also to our CEO, Paul Rickeard, for coming and telling us stories from his own family, regarding World War 2. We couldn't think of a better way to commemorate this day than coming together as a community.



Class News

In Tyne Class we have been reading the story 'Little Glow'. We talked about different celebrations of light in detail for example, Bonfire Night and Diwali. We had lots of fun creating a big pretend bonfire during our Forest Schools session. We enjoyed making beautiful Diva lamps using clay and sat down as a group to meditate. For Remembrance Day, we created poppies to think about the soldiers in World War One. At home you can continue focusing on your reading books and letter formation sheets.

Thames class have been working on partitioning numbers up to 100 and recognising where the numbers should be placed on a number line. In English we have enjoyed writing shape poems about classroom objects using our knowledge of verbs, nouns and adjectives. We have started to practise gymnastics in PE and have mastered some e excellent balances. In Science we have looked at the legacy of Robert Hooke. I am sure the children will enjoy explaining what he discovered.

In Rhine Class this week, we have been working on our newspaper article about the Viking Invasion of Lindisfarne, following our fantastic experience on the island. In maths, we have been learning how to do the inverse operation to check our answers. The children are very competent now to carry out addition and subtraction including exchange. In P.E., we have started both our gymnastics and dance modules. In history, we have found out more about the first recorded Viking Invasion in Britain. In science, we have been finding out how water is transported in plants. Our theme for science is working scientifically and I am sure that the children would love to have a go at some practical science investigations outside of school too.

For Science this half term the children will be exploring how to work scientifically. They will look at independent and dependant variables and how to ensure that the data they have collected is correct, drawing conclusions for their discoveries. Why not try and perform an experiment at home such as, 'What will happen to shaving foam if I squirt it and leave it over night?" The children can make their predictions and then test it out. It would be great to share their discoveries with the rest of the class.
