#### Letter from the Vicar

One of the tricks you soon learn as a Vicar is that the whole of the year is dominated by one date, the date of Easter. Because the date of Easter can vary so much (depending on when the first Sunday after the first full-moon after the vernal equinox, if you are counting), it can fall between 21 March and 18 April. This means that in some years, like last year, Easter was very early, on 27 March, whereas this year it will be very late, on 16 April. The reason why this is important for my diary is that this date then defines how much 'breathing space' we get between the end of Christmas and Epiphany on February 2<sup>nd</sup> and the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Last year there were only eight days between the two and this year there is almost a month! This means that, very unusually, February can be a time to take stock, to enjoy the time and ensure that everything from Christmas is fully packed away before Lent and the often arduous preparations for Holy Week and Easter begin. On a practical level this means I have more time in my diary for the week-by-week things I must do. But on a personal and reflective level it allows me time to enjoy this time for what it is and not just rush from one season of the church's year to another.

February might not be the obvious time to do this, surely enjoying the present moment is easier in the warm summer sun of June than the late winter winds of February. But there is something to using this time to pause and take stock. The Scandinavian life-style idea of Hygge, which has become so popular this year, encourages us to savour the opportunities of these dark winter months, mostly by sitting by fires and wearing warm socks I think. But behind this is a deeper wisdom to savour the gift of this moment.

In the Gospels Jesus shares with us this wisdom as well. In Matthew's Gospel, in a reading we will hear in Church this month, he encourages us to consider the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. In this famous passage, he is encouraging us all to take the chance to pause and consider the great gift of what God gives us all around us all the time; whether in the first buds of spring or the beauty of our landscape, the love of friends or the comforts of home.

I know it is February and I know we all hanker for spring and warmth after the winter. But, if you can, take time to savour this moment and thank God for all he gives us.
