Class News

Tyne class have been thinking about our emotions over the last couple of weeks. We enjoyed reading The Colour Monster and thinking about how colours can describe feelings. Lots of pupils said they felt pink for love! We are continuing to read stories about our emotions including, Ruby's Worry, In My Heart and this week The Lion Inside. You might want to read these stories at home or a story that links to feelings. You can talk about your feelings and a time you might have felt a certain emotion. In Maths we have started to think about sorting and matching, we enjoyed sorting socks into similar sizes and colour patterns. You might want to match socks or different items at home. Every week we add our fun learning onto our school Facebook page, keep looking out for our amazing work!

Thames class have been busy continuing their work on place value. They have used practical resources to find numbers greater than a set amount and numbers less. They have made their own number lines and used symbols to compare numbers. In English they have used bossy verbs to write their own instructions on how to make a jam sandwich. In RE they have been finding out how Christians use bible stories to influence their actions in everyday life and have used the Parable of the Lost Son to support their understanding. They have enjoyed a walk to look at the different materials used to build the church. I am sure they will be able to explain to you which materials have been used. During their walk they went to see the trains as part of their history topic about George Stephenson. The children have enjoyed sharing their homework and looking at pictures of their friends as babies. Thank you for supporting your child with this.

We have had an amazing week in Rhine Class this week. In English, we have begun to write our historical narrative based on our visit to Beamish. In Maths, we have moved onto addition and subtraction using our knowledge of place value. In P.E., we are honing our netball skills and beginning to play matches. In science, we have started our grass investigation and also used our new VR headsets for the first time. We found out some information about 'Eric the Red' in guided reading and we have been sharing our wonderful PSHE homework with our peers. Incredibly busy but fun. If you could please continue to write numbers in numerals and words at home that would be very helpful, along with our regular weekly spellings and reading. Our class has won the class Busby for achieving the most times on spelling shed for the last two weeks - the children love having Busby in our classroom.

Nile class had a great time visiting Beamish. During their visit the children had the opportunity to create a clay plaque which will be delivered to school over the next few weeks. The children enjoyed visiting the dentist and the town house, as well as the Victorian classroom. What similarities and differences can the children list between classrooms today and during Victorian times?
