Beauty and the Beast performance at HBHS

We had another brilliant performance for our Key Stage 2 pupils at Haydon Bridge High School at the end of last term. It was fantastic to see our oldest children perform with such confidence and expression on a stage, with lighting, microphones and props.

We would like to say a big THANK YOU to Haydon Bridge High for welcoming us again and to the staff for their time, effort and patience in pulling off such a wonderful opportunity and show. We issued more than 250 tickets for the audience, thank you to our community for continuing to support events like these.





What a fabulous start to the term in Tyne Class. The children have come back to school refreshed and ready to learn! Last week we enjoyed reading the story 'Whatever Next', the children enjoyed the sensory experience of playing in a black-out tent. We thought about what Baby Bear needed for his trip to Space and talked about what we might like to take on a trip to Space! In maths, we focused on routines and thought about the difference between night and day. We worked as a group and shared our own daily routines. In Forest School, we had fun making beautiful art with the snow, we enjoyed sprinkling the snow onto different surfaces, including our frozen pond! We also made bird feeders as we began our learning about the National Birdwatch.

Thames class have been writing a recount based on The Great Explorer. They have used their knowledge of writing in the first person and past tense. In Maths they have been adding across a 10. In Geography they have looked at why we use a compass and have identified keys on a map. In Science they have classified animals into groups depending on their features. I am sure they will be to explain the characteristics of mammals, reptiles, birds and amphibians.

We have had an amazing time in Rhine Class since our last newsletter. In PSHE, the children have played hot potato and created a graffiti wall to identify emotions and we have thought about how we express our emotions. In Geography, we have been finding out about how mountains are formed, and we are using this knowledge in English to write an explanation text. In P.E., we have started our module on dance and the children choreographed their own dance of the layers of the ocean. In maths, we have started to learn how to multiply a 3-digit number by a 1-digit number. In R.E., we have started to learn about Guru Nanak and in science, we are learning about light sources and how darkness is the absence of light. It would be great if you could speak about reflective surfaces and sources of light with your child when out and about.

During Spring One, Nile Class will be focusing on electrical circuits and coding. The children have completed their first electrical circuit and they understand that light is used on digital devices so we can code. They have then had a brief recap on coding and how the Rainforest Coding program works. Could the children imagine writing a code (a set of instructions) to explain how to make a cup of tea.
